

MONTEREY CAR WEEK 2024 by Diane Mierz

When my sister Sue invited me to join her for Monterey car week I couldn't buy my plane ticket fast enough. We have talked about doing this for years and now that we are both retired could finally devote the time necessary to attend some of its many events. We knew in advance we couldn't do it all so with the exception of the Pebble Beach Concours we focused mostly on events which were free for spectators to attend which included many options.

One surprise for me was how close in proximity everything was - we were based in Carmel so we could easily walk downtown for events based there. - Pacific Grove and Monterey were a few miles away and with so many events happening concurrently even when we drove to events we really didn't sit in traffic as long as we planned our routes out, parking as early as possible.

This honestly was one of the coolest car-related things I have ever done - I wasn't prepared for the variety of really interesting cars to all be in one local for a solid week. It got to the point where there were so many super and hyper cars milling around that we wouldn't even look up when we heard the familiar angry hornet whine of a Lamborghini or Koniggseg drive by Vintage Ferraris, Aston Martins, and Jaguars were everywhere and Porsches were beyond plentiful - including 356s.So many incredible vehicles -one offs, million dollar plus price tags, past concours winners - they could be seen parked on side streets and cruising down the roads of town; my sister and I would typically hit an event or two and then just spend the rest of the day walking around town checking out what was parked in driveways and just parked along the street. Truly sensory overload...

On Monday we attended the Porsche Monterey Classic held at Porsche of Monterey. This was its 7th year and was free to spectators - It appeared that the dealership was cleared of all of their inventory and made available to Porsches on display- and there must have been at least 25-30 356s.My favorites included a beautiful Fjord green roadster, a 1965 paint to sample Meissen Blue C cabriolet (which would turn up at other events) and was what appeared to be a fairly original 1954 speedster. There was free champagne and a lovely display of 356s in their service area. A great way to start the week offl

Our next event held Tuesday was based in Carmel, called "Concours for a Cause" which benefits local charities. Ocean Avenue and side streets in downtown Carmel are blocked off and a variety of vehicles are displayed in different areas. There were 3 live bands set up in different areas - a Beatles band playing for the British cars, an Oom-pah band playing for German vehicles and a American band playing for everything else. There was a huge variety in the automobiles featureda boat tailed Bentley and a 1920s cement truck to name a few. The Meissen blue cab made another appearance along with some beautiful speedsters - notably one painted Glacier white with a green interior.

Other very interesting and rare cars included a 1957 Denzel complete with racing history and a 1958 Beeskow Rometsch, just incredible.

On Wednesday we hit "The Little Car Show" held on the streets of Pacific Grove. This show limits entrants to 1800cc or smaller engines so the lineup tended to be somewhat eclectic and quirky. Fiats, tiny BMWs, a pristine purple Geo Metro, Minis. There were a few 356s including a nice 61 red notchback similar to our own Greg Lane's.

Pebble Beach's Tour d'elegance was held Thursday. This is a 70 mile tour open to all entrants to the concours. A vehicle participating in the tour has a leg up in competition at the concours against one which didn't drive it. The tour runs from Pebble Beach, down Route 1 to Big Sur and back. We staked out a place along Route 1 and it was incredible to watch such showpieces just drive by, one after another at a pretty fair clip.

I had heard from a friend earlier in the week that a twin to my car was to be auctioned off at Mecum on Friday. When I watched the video he sent I was able to freeze the picture to determine what the VIN of the car was and was astounded to realize that it was one digit off what my car is- I had known this car existed in unrestored condition but not that it had been sold and subsequently beautifully restored by Thomas Drummond III of California. I knew I needed to see this car which had been on the assembly line in back of mine, so my sister and I attended Mecum Thursday as spectators. The car was absolutely beautiful and I am glad I got to see it and it did sell but I have no idea who bought it or where it will wind up. As luck would have it Mecum unveiled Jerry Seinfeld's ex Steve McQueen 917K while we were there to be auctioned off in Florida next year. Very cool car but behind a wall of plexiglass so you couldn't get too close to it.

Friday was also the PCA Werks reunion located a half mile away from Mecum so we were able to walk there, avoid the traffic jam to it and also not have to pay \$40 to park. The 356 class had another great line up of beautiful cars including a beautiful stone grey/green cabriolet which won the class. A well travelled 1957 Carrera GT was on display as well as the Denzel we had seen previously. One of my favorite cars at Werks was parked in spectator parking - what seemed to be a pretty original speedster complete patina and dirt.

We hit the Concours d'Lemons Saturday which was chock full of rusty, dented wonders but alas no 356s.We did see a ratty 911 and clapped out 928, though. Such a fun event where no one takes their cars seriously and bribing the judges is not only commonplace but expected. After this we walked to the "Exotics on Broadway" which abounded super and hyper cars. One vehicle of note was a beautiful Emory Speedster- just lovely in every detail.

Sunday was our last full day and the Concours d'elegance at Pebble Beach. The whole experience was just amazing and the venue on the 18th hole of the Pebble Beach golf course has got to be the most breathtaking location for a car show. The lineup was spectacular and the classes varied -


featured marques were Packard and Maserati and a extremely interesting class for wedge-shaped cars. There was an exhibition of Queen Elizabeth's Rovers. Pre and post war preservation classes had some of the most spectacular entrants including the 1934 Bugatti Type 59 sports which would win Best in Show. The one 356 entered in the concours was a original 1958 speedster brought over from the UK which was displayed with a case of its early trophies and had been raced successfully at Laguna Seca. In addition to the show field at Pebble Beach there are many tents set up on the perimeter selling everything from event memorabilia to automobilia. There was a artist named Denny Osborne who makes half scale models of Speedsters which appeared incredibly accurate. Photos I took of them are impossible to tell from the real thing. For a cool \$12K he will build one to your specifications but you will have to wait 3 years for it!

Monday, Sue and I took one last drive through downtown Carmel to see if there were any vestiges of car week left. Ferraris and Astons had been replaced by Lexus and garden variety BMWs and we knew it was time to head north. She seems interested in doing this again- perhaps making it an annual event, one I'd be hard pressed to turn down. Honestly, if you ever get the chance to experience Monterey car week I am positive it's the most fun you can have in 168 hours. There is something for everyone; plenty of great places to eat and drink, spectacular views, and enough 356s to satiate the even most hard-core early Porsche fan. It really doesn't get much better than that!

The Connecticut Valley Region – Porsche Club of America (https://cvrpca.com/) held their 51st annual "People's Choice Concours," with supplementary barbecue luncheon, on Saturday, August 24th, 200024, at the Guilford Fairgrounds, in the scenic shoreline town of Guilford, CT. Normally held at the Farmington Polo Grounds in Farmington, CT, it appeared that the concurrent (& mega-popular benefit event) "Dream Ride" event (https://www.dreamride.org/) must've necessitated the venue change this year. Whatever the reason, Diane and I were very pleased to only have to drive one town over to attend!

There were several car show classes broken down by era and model, and for the 356 class, an impressive 10 or so entries made a great early car showing, even if dwarfed by the huge classes dedicated to the later era Porsches. A "featured vehicle class" appears normally to be a part of these CVR-PCA Concours events, and this year it was the first-era of water cooled 911 Porsches, the "996." Great Reflections

TubTech—Batteries

In late July, Alex Dearborn sent an email to the members about a problem he had with a 6 volt battery (see below). His email generated several other emails about batteries. This is not a definitive article about 6 volt batteries, just a recap of those emails and some general information.



As often happen, when someone mentions an issue, several others have the same or similar issues. A couple days after Alex's email, I took my 911 to the gas station to full up for the CT tour. At the station, the engine barely cranked over. It started but the battery needed to be replaced. I realized it was 20 years old. 12 volt batteries are not difficult to find so a quick trip to Auto Zone found and exact replacement of the same brand, DuraCell.

Then after lunch, at the Vanilla Bean, Lise Merrifield's coupe had a dead battery and had to be push started!!!

A quick google search of Porsche 356 6 volt batteries will generate a lot of choices. You just need to find one the right size. The correct Classic size is 8.5 in High x 6.2 in Wide (which is front to back in a 356) x 7.2 in Long (which is left to right in a 356). The Tractor Supply, 9.2 x 7.25

x 9.1, unit fit in my T2, A coupe.

As you can see in the emails below, there are several places that sell 6 volt batteries. Fortunately some tractors and other farm vehicles also use them so

we should be able to get them for some time. I've used a couple from Tractor Supply, but found that the life of theirs was not great. The first one I got from them, an Exide Comp-1NP only lasted 3 years. The second one lasted longer at 7 years. The last 6 volt battery I purchased was from O'Reilly, in 2020, a Fleet & Heavy Duty Super Start. I've been very impressed with it's performance, much stronger that the Tractor Supply's units. I hope it lasts longer. Apparently, however, from Jona Kee's comment, they may no longer offer them.

Optima also sells a 6 volt unit. You may have to make some mods to get it to fit but they will work.

I had a 6 battery failure this month, but with a battery I bought just last year. Turns out the battery, bought "fresh" from a parts store, had a tiny little stamp on it that says "2018"! Lesson learned.

My mech says buy batteries from Tractor Supply, as they have good turnover of stock.

Peter Thompson wrote:

Get your battery from Altman distribution in Ipswich. Their Deka battery has lasted 8 or more years.

Jona Kee wrote-

I've bought a few 6v 19L batteries directly from Napa auto parts. They were new (within the year) and factory correct LxWxH.. The battery cover fit perfect. Neither O'Reilly, Advanced nor Auto zone had them.

Rob Burt wrote-

This is all very helpful. The Lucas 6v I purchased from a Canadian MG specialist lasted 6months! Not for a 356 but a '25 Austin Chummy.

John Schiavone wrote

I use a local Interstate distributor here in SE CT -- maybe you have one in your area?


